Danfoss Position on Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) and Battery Directives

Danfoss supports the objectives of the WEEE Directive (2012/19/EU) and the Battery Directive (2006/66/EC) to further improve the environmental management of WEEE and to contribute to a circular economy and enhance resource efficiency by improving the collection, treatment and recycling of electronics and waste batteries and accumulators at the end of their life. This also includes the aim to advance public health and safety as well as the protection of the environment.

Danfoss has set up processes to ensure compliance with the WEEE and Battery Directives. Responsibilities and appropriate resources have been assigned to enable us to comply with the Directives. Our product portfolio has been evaluated for the open scope phase beginning 15th of August 2018.

We register products in scope with the National Authorities where we place products on the market and report sales volumes as required to collective schemes in each EU/EEA member state.

When we develop new products, we take measures to comply with the design requirements in the Directives.

All Danfoss manufacturing facilities are required to be ISO 14001 certified, and compliance to national and international environmental legislation is part of third party certification procedures.

We trust that the above will satisfy your inquiry into Danfoss' compliance with the WEEE and Battery Directives.
